## Create quiz

Create a new Quiz. You will be asked to provide a title and whether to use a template.

## Create survey

Create a new Survey. You will be asked to provide a title and whether to use a template.

## Create label

Creates a label that you can use to group or categorize your quizzes.

## Edit

Edits The selected quiz.

## Delete

Deletes the selected quiz.

## Edit titles

Change the titles of all of your quizzes.

## Customize page colors

Change various colors of your quiz page, such as links, visited links etc.

## Modify/Add background image

Add a background image or picture to your quiz page

## Modify/Add banner image

Add a banner image or picture to the top of your quiz page.

## Edit/Add upper textblock

Add an upper textblock that can be used to provide instructions

## Edit/Add lower textblock

Add a lower textblock.

## Submissions

This is where you will find the submissions for a quiz. Each student who took the quiz will be listed, along with the number of attempts they used, the amount of time it took them, and whether the quiz has been graded or not.

## Detail

Provides a table with details about the quiz. It includes a column for every question in the quiz and the students response to that question. This option can only be used if the quiz has been graded.

## Reports

Provides summary statistics on the quiz. You can view statistics on the entire quiz, or for specific questions. These statistics are shown for each student who has taken the quiz.

## Summary

Provides summary statistics for questions. This allows you to see if students had trouble with particular questions, or found some questions easy.
